Torridon Primary School- important update

Following the Highland Council's recent public consultation regarding Torridon Primary School, we wanted to let you know about the work the development plan action group is doing regarding the future of the school and ask for your help in making it a success.

The school closure consultation period has now ended and we expect a decision in February 2024. Regrettably, it seems likely that the school will be closed and sold.

From the Highland Council school consultation and our own community survey, we know that the future of the school is considered a priority by many people in our community. Through this process we have also gathered many suggestions for future uses of the building ranging from arts workshops and educational facilities, to accommodation, a bakery and a craft brewery/distillery. People seem very clear that whatever the building is used for it shouldn't compete with existing facilities such as the Community Centre and should not be sold off by Highland Council to become a holiday let. We recognise that there are many people in our community who feel a close connection to the school, given that many are former pupils, and are sad to see the building empty and deteriorating.

The Highland Council is prepared to consider an application to transfer the school building and play park to the community but they will require us to have a sustainable business plan for their future use, including details of how we intend to run and maintain them. We are aiming to have this business plan in place by the time a decision is made on the school's future, ie by February 2024. We therefore have a very short window and limited resources to do a lot of work to consider the feasibility of all the ideas and come up with a proposal. Naturally if Highland Council decide to reopen the school then our work on this will cease and resources be redirected to other projects.

The action plan group will apply for funding to appoint a consultant or development officer to consider the suggestions and identify 1 or 2 that can be taken forward in more detail. These proposals will be presented to a community meeting for discussion and a business plan will be prepared for the agreed option. The consultant(s) will need to work closely with members of the action group and other interested members of the community to ensure we come up with the best proposal possible.

We are very excited and believe there is a real possibility to turn the school into a valuable facility at the heart of our community. To do this, we need the engagement and commitment of as many people as possible. This is <u>your</u> chance to make suggestions and <u>your</u> chance to be involved. It is likely that the next stage would be a public meeting to discuss the suggestions prior to a consultant being engaged.
